

SCGA Dudley-Sullivan Father Son Championship Crescent Pointe Golf Club Bluffton, SC June 16th, 2025 Entry Fee - \$200

Eligibility

Open to 2025 male members of the SCGA who are residents of South Carolina. There are no restrictions on age other than the son must be at least 8 years old. Only one team per family. Entries may be returned to those teams that have not had reasonable activity on their club's handicap roster as of the most recent update.

Entries

Entries must be received by 5:00 p.m. on May 28th, 2025. The field will be limited to 50 teams. Entries will be accepted based on the following – top three & ties from each flight in 2024 will be exempt until May 10th at 5.00 pm. All other entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis.

Format

USGA rules apply, 18-hole alternate shot, stroke play (except that both players will tee off and select one ball to play out the hole.) Fathers 65 & older and Juniors under 14 can play from a shorter set of tees. Teams competing for the Championship must have both players play from the Tournament Tees. Flights will be based on the team's combined handicap index.
